Unit 16 - How to write a discussion

Each child will present arguments and information from differing viewpoints.

Unit 17 – How to perform a play

Each child will play a part in a class performance of a play chosen by their teachers.

Unit 18 - How to structure poems

Each child is to write A poem in stanzas, to be collected in a class anthology.

Maths

Decimals

The children add and subtract decimals within 1 whole using known facts. They will move on to using a formal method to add and subtract decimals later in this block. Through unitising, children are able to make connections between whole numbers and decimals.

Converting Units

The children will revisit both of these units of measure and their relationships to grams and metres, respectively. Begin by discussing what units of measure are and how different units of measure are used for different purposes.

History

Non-European Study: Slavery and Abolitionism

Children will explore how the institution of slavery functioned, including the journey through the middle passage, slave auctions, Plantation life, Resistance (passive and active) and finally its abolition and the key campaigners responsible.

Music

Video Game Music:

Video games have been associated with iconic music and soundtracks since they first appeared in the 1970s. Just as the game technology has rapidly improved and changed the appearance and playing experience of the games, so too has the music changed, from electronic beeping sounds to the expensive, full orchestral scores by famous composers that are used today.

Revision Unit:

In this unit, is an opportunity for the children to recap what they have learnt at primary school in order to ease their transition to the Year 6 Science curriculum.

Geography

Islands of the World:

In this unit, children will study all about different islands of the world. This will include how islands are formed, locating different islands around the world and how human geography and economic activity can change in these areas.
