Unit 13 - How to write a webpage.

Each child will create their own a page designed in the style of a webpage.

Unit 14 - How to write a 'rags to riches' story.

Each child is to write their very own 'rags to riches' story.

Unit 15 - How to write a nonet.

Each child is to write a nonet on a theme of your choice.

Art

Print and Printmaking:

A pattern is a repeated image. The starting point of any pattern is the single element that will be repeated. Printmaking is the process of creating artworks by printing, normally on paper.

Maths

Perimeter and Area

The children build on learning from earlier years to find the perimeters of rectangles by measuring the sides and by calculation.

Statistics

The children explore different sets of data that call for a range of intervals on the vertical axis.

Shape

This step introduces degrees as a unit of measure for turn, including the degree symbol. Looking at 360, 180 and 90 degree turns.

PSHE

Being my Best

In this unit, children will identify their own strengths and talents, identify people who are responsible for helping them stay healthy and safe.

This unit will also seek to help children to recognise that the way people are portrayed in the media isn't always accurate.

History

The French Revolution:

Exploring the social structure of pre-revolutionary France, the reasons for the storming of the Bastille, the reasons behind the execution of Louis XVI, life during revolutionary France, the rise to power of Napoleon and using sources to analyse a significant historical figure.

Computing

Can you code? Scratch

In this unit, we will learn to use the Scratch program to develop the children's understanding of coding and block coding.

Music

Ode to Joy:

Ludwig van Beethoven composed nine symphonies (a long piece of music for the orchestra) many of which contain extremely famous melodies. One of the most famous is Ode to Joy from his 9th and final symphony, which we will learn to play this term.

RE

Enquiry: How do Hindus make sense of the world?

Children will define the fundamental concepts & beliefs of Hinduism, and investigate the significance of Diwali to Hindu beliefs.

Science

Evolution and Humans:

In this unit, children will learn about how humans develop, their health and different ways that advancements in science and technology affect us.

PE

P.E. will take place on a Wednesday for both classes.

For 5S, PE will also take place on a Tuesday.

Geography

Global trade:
